

It is with great sadness that we advise the passing of Pat Prescott, loving wife of life member, Ron. Pat, together with Ron has participated in WBAQ activities over many years and was loved and respected by all.

## REPORTS



First up a BIG THANKS to the members who supplied the boats for our display. The area supplied was larger than in previous shows and we had a little difficulty in making it look full.

We had fifteen watercraft on show, five motor boats, five sail boats and five canoe/kayaks. Also on our area was a small steamboat. The owner is local to Maleny, the hull was built around 1917, and was restored by the current owner. The boiler and engine built by same. The boiler is open vented, low pressure, requiring no special permits to operate.



Apart from our display, the main objective is to involve youngsters in building a small dinghy, approximately 40cm long, using the stitch and glue method. Many thanks go to our President Jim for the time and effort put into learning how Page No.4 to operate a laser cutter as well as being able to tweak the computer program to cut an easy to assemble kit.

We need one on one with most of the young'ns (age 8-13 years) as their strength is often not enough to bend the ply around while tightening the cable ties. The hulls formed up really well, and then were glued by the kids using hot glue guns. The centre thwart was then installed, followed by the foredeck and bulkhead and the rear thwart. The fiddley mast step and partner followed, and finally the skeg. The exercise took about one hour, the fastest about forty five minutes.

Proceeds of the Kid's building exercise were donated to the Show. We processed some 48 kids/kits.

We had at least four new tutors, dropped in at the deep end, all popped up and, I think enjoyed the experience. May be they will return, I hope so. I think that one day one of these youngsters may, when they are a teenager, will remember and build a canoe, kayak. sailing dinghy, eh?.

The Wooden Boat Association of Queensland's static boat display, all be it sparse for the area given, was well received. Check it out on our Facebook site (See top of Page 3)

We also sold \$360 worth of little boats, cars and planes made by Ian P. Proceeds this time, to us.

On Saturday night, the group (16 in number) retreated to the Maleny Pub for a pleasant dinner

The organiser I think holds us in high esteem, although he would like us to do more with the kids, and have a larger display.

I know we can do a bigger display, wait for an invitation, or stronger in about ten months.

The committee will have to decide what we may be able to do extra, kids-wise.

There were a lot of genuine enquiries about building and using wooden boats and hopefully some of these will transform into new members.

Thanks again to all contributors, helpers, and spouses for allowing our indulgence.



Why do you like boatbuilding? It's a question you might have been asked. In response, we usually mumble something about how we "like to work with our hands," or we "like the smell of wood," or just "getting out in the shop." But we've probably never really been very happy with our answer.

Well, guess what? There are actual, clinically established reasons why we like boatbuilding, according to Claremont Graduate University's School



of Behavioral & Organizational Sciences psychologist Mihaly Csikszentmihalyi (say that 3 times fast!), the man credited with discovering "the flow state."

See if these "elements of enjoyment" describe your boatbuilding "optimal" experience.

- 1. You like boatbuilding because it's a challenging task. It's not simple enough to get boring, and it's not complicated enough to create anxiety.
- Merging of action and awareness. You're just in there doing it. You're not conscious of yourself standing in your shop "boatbuilding." You are simply a part of the process and the boatbuilding happens.
- 3. Clear goals. You know exactly what you want to build, how you want it to look. How many other things are this clear-cut in your life?
- 4. Immediate feedback. You look at what you're doing and you know that it's right (or wrong), the joint fits or it doesn't.
- 5. High degree of concentration. You're absolutely into it. Most things that would distract you go unnoticed.
- 6. Altered sense of time. "Are you EVER coming up to dinner?"

So the next time someone asks you why you like boatbuilding, you can say, "There are several reasons I like boatbuilding, six of them to be exact."



The above article *"Six Reasons to Build a Boat"* misses what is, in my opinion, one other essential requirement for a successful build.

**That ingredient is imagination.** Some call it dreaming. To start, you have to imagine yourself sailing in a particular boat. Imagination is an ingredient of any creative pursuit. Think of boat-building as a 'functional sculpture'.

You have to imagine that you can and want to build You have to imagine yourself building it; that you are a boat-builder.

Imagine that it is possible.


You have to imagine what your boat will look like.

Imagine what colours you will use. What type and colour of the sails. Finally you have to imagine launching your boat.

With imagination, two boats built by two people, from the same plans, will always be different and unique.

Alongside this imagination is the practical bits of what, how, who and when. But without imagination, you would never start. John Lennon sang about imagining in 1971... [Chorus] You may say I'm a dreamer But I'm not the only one I hope someday you'll join us And the world will be as one


