Boat addicts take on the Upper Tweed River.

Tumbulgum, Chinderah, Rous River and Murwillumbah all in four days in March 2024.

Dick Reynolds in Kathleen (a Bobcat) and Lester Searle in Leighton (a Navigator), set off from Fingal Heads, heading upriver with fickle winds, while Alex Malcolm in *Explorer* (another Bobcat) launched at Tumbulgum and sailed downstream to meet them in Chinderah.



They met at the big bend and all journeyed to Chinderah. Dick and Alex tied up to the pontoon and set up for sleeping overnight onboard. Once secured they walked the whole 200 meters to the Tavern for revival. Lester sailed back to Fingal, pulled out and joined them later for dinner. After all had made a full recovery, Lester drove home and the Bobcat Boys boarded their boats and motored about 300m to anchor off a small beach. Distance: 6.72nm



The next day saw the catboats claw their way to Tumbulgum. There was lots of tacking before the iron oar took over. The river had one patch of sandbars and was quite narrow. This part of the voyage was through farmland and past Stotts Island nature reserve.



Arriving at the jetty there was a surprise visitor in the form of Peter Tebbutt who couldn't come sailing as planned but instead punished himself by having lunch and casting envious glances at the boats snug against the pontoon.

After lunch *Kathleen* and her skipper sailed back to Fingal Heads while the *Explorer* motor sailed up the Rous River. There is a kayak trail here that is 7 kilometers each way. It is enclosed on both sides by bush and mangroves but does have several landing spots. The river narrows early so wasn't suitable for sailing, but it was very pretty.



Once back on the Tweed Alex scouted around for an overnight anchorage and opted for the opposite bank from the township in a small, sheltered inlet. It was peaceful, no traffic noise or Friday night jubilations. Distance: 10.70nm

The following day *Explorer* e-motored further upstream, past sugar cane fields, past Condong ramp and sugar refinery to the Condong Bridge which has a clearance height of 4.4m HAT.

WHAT??? On the Beacon to Beacon it's meant to be 4.8m. Well... the mast is 4.85m with the windex included. Fortunately, the navigator had planned for this contingency. A tidal range of .6m meant if the voyagers went under the bridge at low tide with the gaff scandalized, there would be a clearance of 150mm. Just in case though, a very nervous skipper sat as far outboard as possible, leaning the boat over to lose mast height. No problem!

Arriving in Murwillumbah, a morning coffee break was enjoyed on the southern side public pontoon before venturing under the town bridge (4.8m easy) at low tide. After a sortie upriver it was back under the bridge to stop at the northern public pontoon and enjoy a walk around the village.

Neither pontoon was inviting enough to moor for the night so downstream it was to find a lovely anchorage before the bridge in a slow current area with no houses.



Once again, a good night's sleep was had. Distance: 8.31nm Tide waits for no man. But man waits for tide. Low tide was 1100 hours (inconvenient) but needed the low tide to get under the bridge again. Once safely through, so blasé, the Explorer tied up to the Condong pontoon and leaving her in charge, the skipper went for a walk into town. The Primary School is still closed due to the 2022 floods. Many houses are under repair.

There is a park at the ramp pontoon with picnic tables for luncheon.

Back on the water the pair sailed to Tumbulgum and pulled out. This was a good trip along a river with lots of amenities and towns to visit. Perfect for putt putts! Distance: 6.62nm

It's the **25th Regatta** since Alan Graham held a one-day putt-putt event back in 1997.

That's right, it's a **silver anniversary** regatta – again we hope to attract lots of boats, past and present and from near and far to attend. Please talk to your friends to encourage them to come and join in!.



There are a few changes to the weekend this year, so please read carefully.

Meet & Greet sign-on this year will be at the OYSTER BAR at the Sandstone Point Hotel, Friday 24th May from 3.00pm until 7.30pm to pick up your Regatta Bags and Core flute number. A briefing will be held. You can arrive at the Oyster Bar by road or boat. Sandstone Point Hotel's **pontoon** is open to all boats, but overnighting isn't permitted. If you're cruising up on Friday, pull in there and wait for the sign in!

Saturday. We have decided to avoid a briefing **on Saturday morning** to avoid crowding around the Marina area. **Sign in and Distribution of bags** and will be at the **Bellara launching ramp.** The Cruise begins at 9am with Scott Ogilvie's "Cuddles" leading the flotilla up the Pumicestone Passage past Donnybrook and back to Toorbul for lunch. Regatta contact frequency is VHF 77.

David Tripcony has organised a **Bribie community** gathering from 9am at **Pacific Harbour Marina**, so there will be a crowd and activities there all day. After lunch and cruising, please go there for the afternoon. Boats on trailers and Classic cars have a designated area in the car park for a static display for the public.

25th Anniversary Dinner. We have negotiated with the **BRIBIE ISLAND HOTEL** for our dinner for up to 200 guests. It's a two course sit down affair including a tea & coffee bar. Register early to secure your tickets as they will be limited.

At the dinner, we will again present the Main trophies and have fun and camaraderie including a Nautical Quiz.

Grand Parade Sunday Pacific Harbour to Sylvan Beach.

Please arrive at the Marina in time to join the parade **leaving the Marina at 9am**. Follow the lead boat's course in the parade (not any incidental vessels so as not to be led astray). Do the full circuit at Sylvan Beach around the BACE buoys as shown in the Regatta booklet, before anchoring or beaching your boat.

Your cooperation in this part of the weekend is critical to the future of the regatta. The only way we keep your costs down is to secure funding to keep the Regatta going by attracting crowds - and they want to see a boating spectacle. Hope you will all be Registering in April to ensure we get the Regatta book correct. It makes it so much easier for our organisation to function to bring you the best weekend we can.

In the last Log article on the passing of lain Oughtred we said that he raced Glen 12 dinghies. That should have read Gwen 12 dinghies.

Thanks, Life Member John Morrison who was familiar with this class from his early days. He says that there are probably not too many of these around today.



A search on the Australian Classic Dinghy Network reveals...

A CLASSIC...

"The Gwen 12 was designed in 1946 by Charlie Cunningham who also designed many popular catamarans. The prototype was built of ¾ inch ply, had an open cockpit with empty kerosene tins for buoyancy and much small sails than later boats. It also had no bowsprit and no trapeze.

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Albert Sailing club was the first to adopt the class in 1950 and built four boats in 3/16th ply with a sail area of 120 sq feet. Sorrento Sailing Club was the second to adopt the Gwen in 1953. The Gwen 12 Association was formed in 1951. In 1955 a bowsprit was added together with a self-draining cockpit.

By the late 1950's the Gwen 12 had spread to every state and a number of countries. A trapeze was added in the late 1950's. It was granted national status in 1964.

In 1951, the "Gwenda" became the Gwen 12 as Cunningham designed the Glen 20 similar to the Payne-Mortlock canoe with twin hiking boards but reputedly faster but more stable. Only a few were built.In the 1970's the cockpit became de-restricted and larger spinnakers were tried. The class died out in the 1980's but there are still enthusiast around.

At the Inverloch Classic Dinghy Regatta there were four restored Gwen 12s. More are being restored in Victoria and South Australia."

THINK ABOUT THIS...

If everything is going well, you have obviously overlooked something



Jim Jones told us of the renovation of Czarina's transom – a 1968 Mirror 16. That time was the preepoxy era. It all started with a small leak in the seat.

As they say.. "from little thing big things grow". The layers were pealed back revealing places where the glue had released and even places of car bog. The history of multiple repairs over the 50 yr + life of the boat were revealed.

The seats and floatation tanks were removed as was the transom. A new transom was constructed and a cedar veneer was added to the outside. The boat had been constructed of 5mm ply – difficult to get these days as it is usually 6mm but some was obtained from Boatcraft. A new rear part of the floor was buttjointed in and the interior was painted a cream colour.

Work on the deck followed with it being stripped back and epoxy glassed. It was painted with red Aquacote – keeping the colour determined by the previous owner Geoff Williams.

The reno took about 18 months – fitted in with other activities of course, but this boat should now live on for another 50 years.


